Established in 1981 by a group of concerned citizens. the foundation assists the City of Tallahassee Parks, Recreation & Neighborhood Affairs Department in acquiring additional sources of funding for programs and facilities. Beyond property acquisition, the primary purpose of the non-profit, taxexempt foundation is to accept gifts for use in the City's nationally recognized park system.

Since 1981, FOOP has received over \$5.2 million in gifts and property. Gifts have included everything from supplies for a sewing class and sponsorship of a youth athletic league to the Oven Park property and house. Recently. the foundation assisted the department in purchasing eight new scoreboards for ball fields around town.
