Renee Miller says she has 64 beds. A 64 bed shelter or group home is a danger to the neighbors and to the people she has staying there. I am sure you are aware what it takes to care for this special population. The proper place, lots of qualified staff and a lot of financial backing.

I have lived here for 18 years. It is so sad how much she has changed our safe in town neighborhood. We do not feel safe.

Comments for the December 14, 2022 meeting of the Planning Commission regarding City Walk's permit application.

12-5-22

The ALJ provided a recommended order to the Planning Commission, indicating that a permit be granted to CityWalk, but with specific conditions. As written, condition (a) "maintain current security protocols which must include camera surveillance monitored in real time with dedicated staff patrolling the grounds" is problematic because it is not known to what extent camera coverage during that period existed. Additionally, "dedicated staff," does not include qualifications of the personnel involved. Security needs to be provided by personnel who are properly trained. This is especially important when among those sheltered, there may be volatile individuals, and those experiencing a mental health crisis. The condition does not mention how often the grounds are to be patrolled, what areas of the property will the camera surveillance cover, and "real-time" monitoring is subject to interpretation. Does it mean to sometimes look at a camera monitor as it transmits a real-time image? Was the intention for the monitoring to be continuous? Lives are at stake. Competent security operations are essential!

I believe that when the ALJ proposed to maintain current security protocols, he must have assumed that competent security protocols were already in place. In order to fulfill the recommended order's intended purpose, the order needs to be clarified at least to the extent presented by the planning commission, *"1. Implement security protocols, which must include no less than 19 surveillance cameras capable of viewing public areas inside and outside the facility and which are monitored in real time by two dedicated security staff between 12 a.m. and 7 a.m. and one staff at all other times patrolling the grounds. Video recordings must be maintained for 2 months. Logs evidencing the security patrols must be kept for 5 years. 2. Security personnel must not be current residents and must be either off-duty law enforcement officers or employees of a bonded and licensed security agency."*

The remaining items of the recommended order, as clarified by the planning commission seems okay, but there is one thing I believe is missing in reference to "vigorous enforcement." The permit is contingent upon successfully preventing problems caused by shelter residents in the community. However, historically, CityWalk has indicated that responsibility for residents behaviors end at the property line. CityWalk's only mechanism for vigorous enforcement is to ban offenders from the facility. If CityWalk's vigorous enforcement fails to prevent ongoing problems associated with its existence in the community, does their permit remain in force? In order to ensure motivation for enforcement remains vigorous, shouldn't there also be consequences for CityWalk?

I don't believe a permit should be granted while the facility is not compliant with building and safety codes.

Citizen Comments, Dec. 5, 2022

I ask the Planning Commission to enter a Final Order adopting the Administrative Law Judge's (ALJ) Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law **with the clarified conditions agreed to by the Commissioners at their January 12, 2022 public hearing.** These conditions are incorporated at the end.

These conditions made specific the ALJ's conditions set out in the order section of his Recommended Order, which adopted and incorporated City Walk's own rules for residents. These rules were presented to the ALJ as a part of City Walk's Transitional Residential Housing permit application.

The ALJ recommended the following in the Order section of his order:

RECOMMENDATION Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is RECOMMENDED that the City of Tallahassee grant the City Walk-Urban Mission, Inc.'s application to operate a transitional residential facility, pursuant to section 10-417 of the Tallahassee Land Development Code, at the property located at 1709 Mahan Drive, Tallahassee, Florida, with the following conditions: (a) maintain current security protocols which must include camera surveillance monitored in real time with dedicated staff patrolling the grounds; (b) no resident discharges between the hours of midnight and 7:00 a.m.; (c) if there is an urgent need that requires discharge of a resident between the hours of midnight and 7:00 a.m., then City Walk shall obtain the assistance of law enforcement or private security; (d) vigorous enforcement of City Walk's existing prohibitions against panhandling, loitering, traveling through certain neighborhoods, and patronizing certain businesses; (e) no acceptance of anyone who has been convicted of a sex-related offense; (f) no admission of anyone who is prohibited by statute from residing at 1709 Mahan Drive due to the proximity of schools and daycare facilities; (g) capping the number of full-time residents at 64; (h) no provision of basic necessities such as food and clothing to anyone who is not a resident; (i) maintenance of a resident log in order to assist with ascertaining residents' whereabouts; and (j) implementation of random and routine checks for contraband in the residents' rooms.

City Walk-Urban Mission, Inc. v. City of Tallahassee, DOAH #21-001262 at 40 (Nov. 19, 2021).

The attorneys for both parties agreed that condition (h) was unconstitutional, so the Commission struck it from the conditions. Blindly, adopting the ALJ's order with this condition is contrary to law and the intent of the circuit court's judgment. Additionally, it is beyond the authority of the Commission.

Adopting the Commission's conditions faithfully follows the Leon County Circuit Court's judgment.

The Circuit Court ordered:

19. Therefore, for the foregoing reasons, the Court finds the Commission failed to adhere to the essential requirements of the law, specifically, Section 2-138(n), Tall. Land Dev. Code and Art. IX, sec. 10(g), Bylaws, when it reweighed the evidence and substituted its own findings of fact for that of the ALJ's without a proper determination of whether there was competent substantial evidence to support the ALJ's findings. Accordingly, it is hereby **ORDERED** and **ADJUDGED** that the Commission's decision is hereby **QUASHED**. Since this Court has granted the relief requested by Petitioner via certiorari, this Court makes no determination regarding Petitioner's RLUIPA and RFRA claims. This case is hereby **REMANDED** *for reconsideration consistent with the requirements of section 2-138(n), Tallahassee Land Development Code and Article IX, sec. 10(g), of the Bylaws.*

City Walk-Urban Mission, Inc. v. City of Tallahassee, Leon County Cir. Ct., Case No. 2022 AP 000001 (Sept. 7, 2022) *emphasis in italics added.*

Article IX, section 10(g) of the Bylaws of the Planning Commission provide:

Section 10. Action on Recommended Order; Transcript; Exceptions; Response to Exceptions; Scheduling; Consideration of the Recommended Order; Action on the Recommended Order.

(g) Action on the Recommended Order. The Planning Commission shall adopt the recommended order, adopt the recommended order with changes, or direct staff to prepare a revised order.

The circuit court cited the Commission's rule on reviewing an ALJ'S Recommended Order:

When presented with an ALJ's recommended order:

The Planning Commission shall adopt the recommended order, adopt the recommended order with changes, or direct staff to prepare a revised order. . **the planning commission shall not change any finding of fact reached by the administrative law judge unless after review of the entire record, the planning commission finds there is no competent substantial evidence to support the administrative law judge's findings. The planning commission may change conclusions of law if it is found that the administrative law judge did not apply the correct law.** If the planning commission directs staff to prepare a revised order, the revised order shall be submitted to the planning commissioners. The chair shall sign the order.

City Walk-Urban Mission v. City of Tallahassee, Leon County Cir. Ct., Case 2022 AP 00001 (Sept. 7, 2022) at 7, quoting, sec. 2-138(n), Tall. Land Dev. Code.

The Planning Commission, as it set out to do in January drafted a final order that **adopted the recommended order with changes** that clarified and made specific for City Walk the conditions that would be enforceable. Arguably, some of the ALJ's conditions are unenforceable as written or raise questions as to what actions are violations of the permit. Clarity is required. Adoption of the Commission's conditions is consistent with the ALJ's order and the circuit court's judgment.

After much discussion, the Commission agreed to the following clarifications to the Administrative Law Judge's conditions at its January 12, 2022 meeting on City Walk's Transitional Residential Housing permit application, but voted to deny the permit instead of adopting these conditions:

1. Implement security protocols, which must include no less than 19 surveillance cameras capable of viewing public areas inside and outside the facility and which are monitored in real time by two dedicated security staff between 12 a.m. and 7 a.m. and one staff at all other times patrolling the grounds. Video recordings must be maintained for 2 months. Logs evidencing the security patrols must be kept for 5 years.
2. Security personnel must not be current residents and must be either off-duty law enforcement officers or employees of a bonded and licensed security agency.
3. No resident discharge between the hours of midnight and 7:00 a.m. But if there is an urgent need that requires discharge of a resident between the hours of midnight and 7:00 a.m., then City Walk shall obtain the assistance of law enforcement or private security.
4. Vigorous enforcement of following the required prohibitions and consequences, [which City Walk presented to the ALJ]:

a. Businesses on Mahan Drive and homeowners in nearby streets are not supportive of our services. They do not want any of our guests from our church on their property for any reason. This especially includes Florida Therapy and Patients First. They have a blanket trespass and TPD will have you arrested if you step on their property.

b. No loitering. No loitering at bus stops, area businesses, empty lots, intersections, bus stops, and strip centers.

c. No panhandling. Any one seen in the area panhandling, flying a sign, approaching anyone for money, will be immediately banned from our property.

d. Bathrooms are available 24/7. This is where you must relieve yourself. No outdoor urination or defecation on our property or any neighboring properties.

e. The residential streets within ½ mile radius are not to be used by guests of our facility. Do not walk through these residential areas. Neighborhood Watch in these areas will let us know. You will be banned from this facility.

f. No public drinking of alcohol. Do not visit the Marathon Station and the beer store and drink on your way here. Anyone seen drinking in the area will not be permitted onto the campus. You will be permanently banned from our property.

g. Do not go into neighboring businesses. They do not want you there. They are actively seeking to close our campus because of the traffic in homeless individuals []their business.

h. No drugs. [possession or use of drugs] you will be permanently banned.

5. Implementation of random and routine checks for contraband in the resident's rooms. Residents' rooms and residents upon entry are subject to a nightly search. Retention of these records for 12 months.
6. No acceptance of any new individual who has been designated as a sex offender or who is required to register as a sex offender pursuant to s. 943.0435, Fla. Stat.
7. No individual who is prohibited by statute or court order may reside at 1709 Mahan Drive.
8. Maintenance of a mandatory sign-in daily resident entrance and exit log, [which is]maintained by security staff, in order to assist with ascertaining residents' whereabouts. Such log will be maintained for 1 year.
9. Come into and maintain compliance with the Florida Building Code [upon approval of Type B permit]. Capping the number of full-time residents at 64 subject to limitations in any applicable code.
10. Maintain the practice of requiring prospective residents of the Mahan facility to initially report to the City Walk facility at 1105 N. Monroe Street for a triage like assessment of their needs and whether the TRF services are appropriate for them, and whether they are sober, lucid, and agree to abide by the rules. If City Walk determines that it does not provide appropriate services for a particular person, then it will refer that person to a provider better able to address that person's needs.

While I appreciate the DOAH judge understanding the need to rein in such a poorly managed facility, I am at a loss as to who is going to enforce any of these conditions that the judge set forth. There does not appear to be an agency or mechanism in place to handle enforcement of the judge's conditions.

I would like to believe that the judge realized the extreme need to hold City Walk's management accountable for their actions and conduct of the facility. I am disappointed a judge chooses to put such a problematic facility so close to a wonderful neighborhood. Based on the facility's past record, there is no doubt in the mind of the neighbors that if City Walk were to become a permanent facility, it will be to the detriment of this neighborhood. We saw that in the short time it was open, there was a dramatic rise in calls for police service.

I hope the judge realizes the burden he is putting on this neighborhood and the almost certain issues and dangers that this facility will bring. In the short time that the facility has been there, and it is not even supposed to have been open, there have been at least three deaths in the facility.

With regards to City Walk's application to operate a transitional housing shelter at 1709 Mahan Dr, I would like to submit comment, as in the past, that among other concerns, safety for the shelter residents is an ongoing (& insufficiently addressed) concern. This concern is reflective of the 3 deaths of residents (that I'm aware of) that have occurred (two discovered Thanksgiving week this year). After Chris Halligan passed away June 18, 2021, it is my recollection that City Walk promised to do better and implement some safety measures and protocols to insure that a death didn't occur and go undetected & to try to better protect residents. The police reports of the two deaths discovered Thanksgiving week indicated that rigor mortis had set in. That doesn't sound as if City Walk is actually doing any better for its clients.

It does not sound to me as if there is much done in terms of safety and oversight. Residents are likely to have medical conditions, dependency problems and/or mental conditions which I don't believe City Walk is in a position to address, manage or even monitor.

I don't think a shelter set up in an old office building abutting neighborhoods is a great idea. I certainly don't think it's a safe one, even for the residents.

We are Daniel & Michelle Bolstridge and we are business (and land) owners of Ashtin Technologies just down from City Walk. Please carefully consider Renee Miller's past history with the City of Tallahassee when preparing your decision on December 14, 2022.

While a homeless shelter can be a good thing, the location must be considered as well impact on surrounding homes and businesses. We had no issues with homeless prior to the opening of City Walk. After City Walk opened, issues abound.

Some issues we have are: harassment of clients in our parking lot, sleeping in our parking lot (both during business hours and nighttime), trash, begging for money, urinating on our building (and the neighbor's), defecating in the grass (and then smearing it on the adjoining building), leaving shopping carts on site, and stealing our shipping pallets. There are currently 4 shopping carts on our site from the last 2 weeks alone. I am tired of having to load the shopping carts in my pickup and return them to the rightful owner. None of this is good for business.

Renee Miller has made it clear that she has no intention of following the city's requests and is currently in violation. I am not sure why exceptions would be made at this point. Does the city actually expect that if they grant her leniency that she will follow them either? The city made no exceptions for us when we renovated our business property and I feel that the same should to be required of City Walk.

Attached are the death reports/investigation where the two bodies were found within the same week without autopsies where rigor mortis set in and the residents were not seen for several days according to the two managers, Boysie Cooper and Pamela Moody. It was called a Death Investigation Report. Both rooms were locked when the police arrived, but they had been entered by CW to determine that there had been a death. Both individuals were on their back with their stomachs exposed.

Also attached is a case where an individual was arrested on City Walk's property accused of committing aggravated battery on a person 65 years of age or older. He must have been a resident because City Walk retained possession of the accused's property -- although an employee of City Walk called the police - according to the Manager Emily Sellner.

I've seen this individual in our neighborhood, Jesse Dewayne House many times barely able to walk. He cruises by CW a lot. Maybe he hangs out back, takes a shower in their outdoor showers? I guess when he's released he will head back to CW to gain access to his possessions.

THIS WAS LAST WEEK ONLY!!!!

I no longer ride my off road bike on the trail behind CW. It's not safe anymore because of the homeless that are attracted to our area. It is a trail that takes you out to Tom Brown Park, Alford Greenway all off road. It was such a great asset of the City. I no longer take pottery at Tallahassee Clay Arts because of the homeless loitering in the past.

Homelessness is everywhere in our City. It will never be eliminated nor controlled. BUT, I do expect a facility that wants to house 60-plus individuals to have safeguards in place who are not volunteers, who do not live there and earn their keep by keeping our neighborhoods safe. I expect people who are trained and professionals, who are not trying to remain sober, who are not in a wheelchair, oxygen or who are transitioning from homelessness. I expect them to be screened as to their emotional capacity and physical capacity with background checks.

I also would like to see call buttons in each room so the physically impaired can call for help and not be left in their room to die for several days.

How about indoor showers? The City should be ashamed! If and when showers are built they need to have call buttons as well.

Of course there would be fire suppression systems throughout the building. Again, how can someone let this go on for two years housing people and collecting their Social Security without a fire suppression system? How? Does CW have an umbrella or liability insurance on their residents. Those third parties need to be protected.

I would like the staff/CNA to be held accountable for checking "everyday" on the individuals.

We need a sign-in and sign-out sheet and they need to really stick to this.

If a resident is released or kicked out, they need to be escorted by the police or the City's social services so they are not just dumped on the curb.

The City needs to provide social services for CW's clients or City Walk needs to employ full-time staff every day of every week. City Walk needs a 24/7 CNA to change their diapers, Depends, escort them outside in the back to take a shower (still can't believe this) if they are in a wheelchair, assist with their array of medications, check on them throughout the day.

If the residents are paying with our Federal Money, City Walk needs a dietitian who will ensure the residents are eating properly, especially those with diabetes.

As far as the sober living - well, I don't know too much about how that all works, but someone should be in charge of that alone. Seems like a big job with a lot of dynamics that go into alcoholism and drug addiction with possible underlying mental health issues. Big job!

The Federal Government needs to work in conjunction with the City of Tallahassee to make sure that the clients' Social Security checks are helping the individuals and not going in the hands of CW. That's Federal Money!!!

The City needs to work in conjunction with TMH when they release individuals who may be better suited for a hospice situation - especially if they are on Medicare, Medicaid - Federal Money.

City Walk obtained PPE dollars from the Federal Government (I believe). Where did that money go?

The Feds and the City - let's get going and make it right. The City started this! The Federal Government helped fund it through PPE.

I asked at a City Commission meeting who will enforce the Administrative Law Judge's ruling. Mayor Dailey looked at Cassandra Jackson, our City Attorney, and she replied "The City."

Has the City? I believe that is what you are here to determine and determine for our neighborhoods. Oh, wait, you are not God. Only CW will listen and do what God tells her.

I was dispatched to an unattended death at City Walk, a homeless shelter. Call notes indicated PROBLEM: RESIDENT UNRESPONSIVE, BEYOND HELP DECEASED IS ON AN OXYGEN MACHINE THAT IS STILL RUNNING. CALLER IS A MANAGER AND NO ONE HAS SEEN THE RESIDENT FOR A FEW DAYS. (4)

On arrival I met with Reporting Person Moody. She said she had last seen Decedent Battle alive on Monday about dinner time. She said he usually kept to himself in his room with his door closed. She said that a resident hadn't seen Battle in a few days, prompting concern. The resident notified staff member Boyd Cooper (850)300-2962 who checked on Battle with a master key and found him unresponsive.

Moody was familiar with Battle and told me as much as she knew about his medical history. It included type 1 diabetes, kidney injury, a fall that required hospitalization and pneumonia. His last hospitalization was earlier this month. His diagnosis was pneumonia and he came home with an O2 system.

When I entered Battle's room it was disorganized but did not look like a physical struggle had happened. His front door had been found locked and the bedroom window was intact. He was lying with his torso on his bed on his back. His left arm was straight town, hand by his hip and his right arm was bent with his hand by his head. His knees were bent and his feet were on the floor. He was wearing his oxygen canula and it was still blowing. He was wearing a white A-line undershirt, pulled up to expose his stomach, black shorts, Depends undergarments, and black socks. His skin was cold, rigor mortis had begun in his arms and legs. I did not see noticeable lividity. His eyes were slightly open.

We were unable to get any of his doctors to answer the phone so Ofc. Gaston called ME Dakota Bragg and discussed the case with her. She said it was a non-ME case and released the body.
